She served as a Eucharistic Minister and she was one of the founding members of the BeFriends ministry at St. Joseph's.

She met and married Jim Taylor on July 11, 1980. They were a very loving couple and it was a joy to be in their company. According to Jim, Faye taught him what love was all about. Faye was totally committed to family. She loved her daughter, Tonya; and her granddaughter Burgundy was the apple of her eye.

Faye responded to an advertisement in the St. Joseph bulletin in the fall of 1997, concerning Lay Salvatorians. She journeyed with the first group of Lay Salvatorians in Alabama and made her commitment on December 8, 2000.

Unfortunately, Faye's life as a Salvatorian was cut short. She experienced complications following surgery in October 2001 and was in a coma for several weeks before going to God on December 6, 2001.
